



“Quilts in Bloom” Quilt Show June 9-10, 2023 - Yamhill County Fairgrounds
Friday, June 9th 10 am – 6 pm & Saturday, June 10th 10 am – 4 pm

General Guidelines:

Quilt Registration Opens: March 1, 2023

Quilt Registration Closes: May 1, 2023

Application forms will be available either at the guild meetings (3/15 & 4/19) or may be downloaded and printed from our website (willamettevalleyquilters.com). Applications must be returned by May 1, 2023 either in person at a guild meeting or by mail to: Willamette Valley Quilters, Attn: Quilt Entry; PO Box 1468, McMinnville OR 97128.

Every guild member submitting a quilt will be required to work a 2 hour shift at the show.

Registration Cost and Processing:

Along with the registration form, the following is required at registration:

- \$5 per quilt with a maximum of 2 quilts
- a color photo (any size) of each registered quilt (photos return not guaranteed)

Quilt Size and Shape:

Quilt size: no larger than 80 inches x 80 inches. *Quilt shape:* square or rectangle.

Label

A fabric label with the exhibitor’s name must be sewn to the back of each quilt

Quilt Drop off and Pick-up:

Quilts may be dropped off **ONLY** on **Thursday, June 8th from 7-9 a.m.** at the Yamhill County Fairgrounds. Quilts may be picked up at the conclusion of the show at the Fairgrounds on **Saturday, June 10th between 4:30-5:00 p.m.**

A designated person other than the exhibitor may pick up the quilt if they submit the pick-up ticket for the quilt at the conclusion of the show. Any quilts left unaccounted for will be taken home by a volunteer and the exhibitor will be contacted. The exhibitor must arrange to pick up the quilt directly from the volunteer’s home and not at a quilt guild meeting.

Quilt Display:

All quilts must remain on display for the duration of the show. **NO ONE** is authorized to take down their own quilt, including those of the volunteers present at the show. **No exceptions.** The guild members charged with the care and handling of the quilts must do the accompanying paperwork to ensure all the quilts have been returned safely to their owner or person authorized to pick up the quilt/s.

The Right to Refuse:

The Willamette Valley Quilters Board reserves the right to refuse any entry for any reason – including condition of the quilt – and all decisions of the Board will be final.
